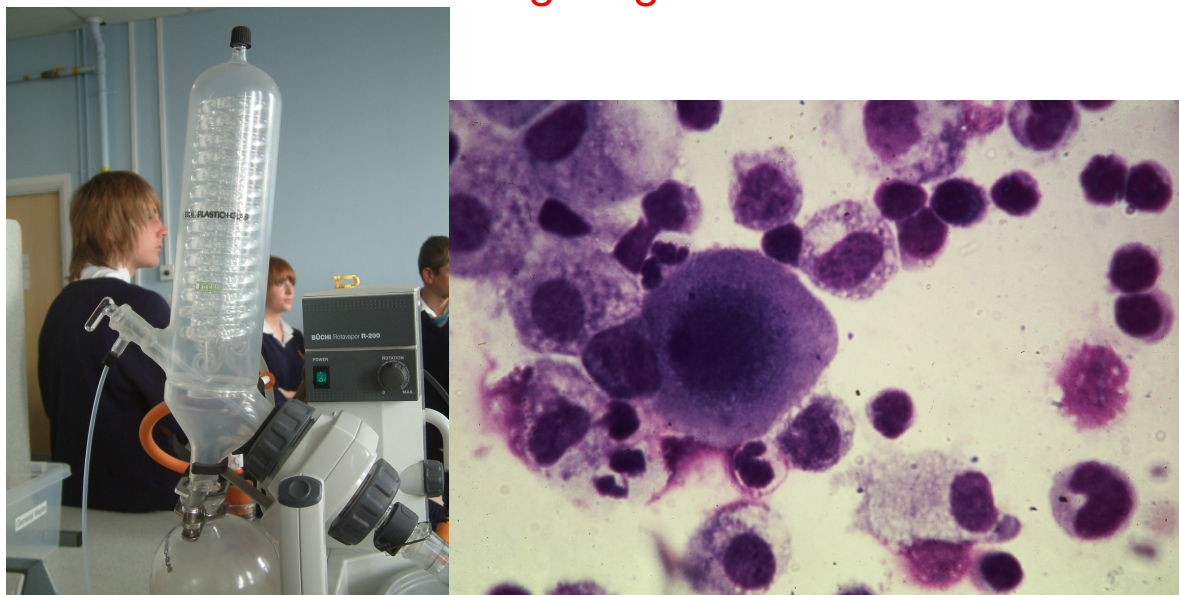


2nd July 2008 'Chemistry at Work' University of Teesside
